NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING**

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Village Board of the Village of Harriman will hold a public hearing on a proposed local law #5 amending and revising various sections of the Code of the Village of Harriman pursuant to Sections 10 and 20 of the Municipal Home Rule Law at Harriman Village Hall, 1 Church Street, Harriman, New York on September 9 at 7:15 p.m. or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard.

This Local Law will amend portions of Sections 140-51F, 74-5C and 74-5G regarding the requirement of posting an escrow amount with the Zoning Board of Appeals. The amendment will clarify that it does not apply to residential applicants and will facilitate an understanding and enforcement of the section.

All persons interested in the subject of the proposed local law will be heard by the Village Board at the above time and place. Persons may appear in person or by agent. All written communications addressed to the Board in connection with the proposed local law must be received by the Village Board at or prior to the public hearing.
